At Lovers' Lane Primary, art is integrated into our foundation curriculum. This ensures that our art curriculum is relevant, and meaningful to the children, and enables them to apply their knowledge of a historical or geographical topic.

- Select appropriate media and techniques and adapt their work where necessary.

## **In Key Stage 1**

### **Pupils are taught:**

- to use a range of materials creatively to design and make products
- to use drawing, painting and sculpture to develop and share their ideas, experiences and imagination to develop a wide range of art and design techniques in using colour, pattern, texture, line, shape, form and space about the work of a range of artists, craft makers and designers, describing the differences and similarities between different practices and disciplines, and making links to their own work.

## **In Key Stage 2**

### **Pupils are taught:**

- to create sketch books to record their observations and use them to review and revisit ideas to improve their mastery of art and design techniques, including drawing, painting and sculpture with a range of materials [for example, pencil, charcoal, paint, clay]

## **Whole School**

Throughout the academic year, our pupils work on whole school art projects which are led by our Art Leader. Pupils work collaboratively on different aspects of the project. The artwork created during our whole school projects
