<p>The vision for Modern Foreign Languages (MFL) at Lovers' Lane Primary is to develop communicative skills and to encourage intercultural knowledge and understanding. We seek to open students' minds to different cultures whereby students feel "Citizens of the World". Furthermore, we want to nurture a lifelong passion and curiosity for languages and to consolidate the skills for future language learning. Culture capital is developed through Spanish, learning a different language is giving the children the power to be more knowledgeable, giving them the opportunity to understand and realise that different people, live, believe, act in a different way is enhancing their experiences of the world. The use of songs and games make the language fun and engaging, allowing children to be more confident speakers and readers in the future. We put Spanish into context by comparing its structures to other languages. Access to familiar stories and songs help children to recognise known ideas and concepts in Spanish.</p> <p>Years 5 & 6 Building on previous learning, children will be introduced to new vocabulary and semantical structures to express new ideas. The focus is now placed on reading and writing in Spanish. More challenging songs and stories will give children access to more advanced language. They will start developing translation and interpreting skills. Children will get opportunities to research the religion and culture of Spain and Spanish speaking countries.</p>	<p>Our Spanish Curriculum is high quality, well thought out and is planned to demonstrate progression.</p> <p>If children are keeping up with the curriculum, they are deemed to be making good or better progress.</p> <p>In addition, we measure the impact of our curriculum through the following methods:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A reflection on standards achieved against the planned outcomes; • A celebration of learning for each term which demonstrates progression across the school; • Pupil discussions about their learning; which includes discussion of their thoughts and ideas.
